What Is a Leaked Video?

A leaked video is any video that was shared or published without the explicit permission of the individual(s) involved. This may include:

- Personal or romantic moments intended to remain private
- Footage recorded without someone's knowledge (e.g., in private spaces)
 - ♦ It can cause mental health crises, including anxiety, depression, and trauma
 - ♦ It ruins reputations, families, and careers
 - ♦ It invites online hate, abuse, and blackmail
 - ♦ And it spreads faster than the truth ever can

Fame, status, or gender doesn't matter — everyone is vulnerable, and no one deserves to be publicly exposed without their consent.

Pause Before You Share

We've all been tempted to share a link or screenshot with a friend. It's easy. It feels harmless. But here's what you're really doing:

-  Amplifying someone else's pain
-  Turning real people into entertainment
-  Rewarding those who break trust and boundaries

Ask yourself:

- ♦ Would I be okay if this video was about me?

- ♦ Is this helping or hurting someone?
- ♦ Am I proud of my digital footprint?

If you have even a small doubt, don't share it.

What You Can Do Instead

Want to be part of the solution? Here's how:

- ✓ Report leaked or harmful content — don't ignore it
- ✓ Speak out against digital bullying
- ✓ Share stories with positive messages
- ✓ Encourage empathy and awareness in your circles
- ✓ Support victims instead of shaming them

Let's Build a Safer, Kinder Internet

We often forget: the internet is made of people. Real people with feelings, families, and futures. Whether it's a public figure or a private citizen, no one deserves to be reduced to a viral moment. We need to normalize respect, consent, and boundaries — both offline and online.
