- 4. Relatability When people see themselves in content, they love to share it
- 5. Platform Algorithms Social networks promote popular posts for more reach

A leaked viral video is content that wasn't meant for public viewing — but somehow gets released, intentionally or not — and then spreads like wildfire **(a)**.

Behind-the-scenes or backstage clips

Celebrity DMs or private calls

Workplace or political recordings

These types of videos may generate interest fast, but they often raise serious privacy and ethical concerns �
